Intro:

1. The _____: My sin and selfishness make a mockery of God. My attempt at good works will not fix that. (19-20)

2. God's _____: All who have an active belief in Jesus as God, risen from the dead, will have Jesus' righteousness applied to them rather than their own unrighteousness. (21-23)

3. Him For _____: Jesus death and blood are my replacement payment, which I receive in humble faith. (24-25)

4. God's _____ On Display: Jesus shows off God's perfection and His love as He willingly justifies those with faith even when they do not deserve it. (25-26)
